
### Audio-Visual Accessibility for All: Empowering People Through Technology

From watching TV shows and movies to participating in online meetings and webinars, audio-visual media has become an integral part of how we learn, connect, and entertain ourselves. For individuals with hearing impairments, captions and subtitles are essential tools.

### **Accessible Media Tools: Subtitles and Captioning Services**

Major streaming platforms like Netflix, YouTube, and Disney+ offer captions and subtitles on their videos, making it easier for people with hearing impairments to enjoy their favorite shows and movies. There are two types of captions:

- Closed Captions (CC): These captions can be turned on or off, and they include not only dialogue but also non-verbal sounds such as "(phone ringing)" or "(audible laughter)."
- Subtitles: Subtitles typically only translate spoken dialogue and may not include sound descriptions.



### Real-Time Captioning for Online Meetings

Platforms like Zoom and Microsoft Teams have integrated real-time captioning features, making it easier for people with hearing impairments can fully participate in discussions. In addition, some services, like Verbit and Otter.ai, offer more advanced captioning solutions for webinars and virtual events, ensuring better accuracy and inclusivity.

As awareness grows and technology continues to advance, we can look forward to a future where audio-visual accessibility for all is standard practice, enriching the lives of people with hearing impairments and enhancing the quality of their digital experiences.


